An Open Letter to The Student-Athletes & Communities In Ohio Affected by the COVID-19 Issue

While the emotions you have gone through hearing the news today of our remaining winter sport tournaments being canceled are challenging, we understand what you are going through.

We know what was denied you. We know what your dreams and goals are. It is emotional. We know the welcome back from District and Regional titles or the school pep rally for the state qualifier are all denied. We know how your parents, teammates, friends and coaches have instilled in you that "work hard and good things will happen". Today, you are also realizing one of the best virtues taught in athletics – dealing with adversity. Adversity has been brought on by an enemy that very few ever expected. You have been asked by your coaches and teachers to look at 'Teamwork' in an entirely different way. Now, I am asking you to do the same...to be the leaders we KNOW you are to help defeat an opponent that is more formidable than any our generation has competed against.
